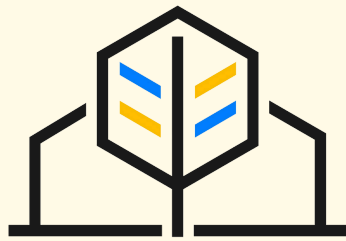

CAREERS EDUCATION IN EACH SCHOOL YEAR

Primary Students

The focus will be on understanding stereotyping within career roles. Students will receive visits from and to employers and charities. The careers lead will attend lessons and produce a careers-based work booklet.

Year 7

The focus is about introducing careers and thinking about the vast number of careers/jobs available. How a business runs, qualities and skills that employers look for as well as and rights and responsibilities in the world of work.

Year 8

The focus is linking our plans and dreams to reality. Identifying a support network when considering careers and recognising health and safety risks.

Year 9

The focus is self-assessment, considering own strengths, stereotyping and discrimination as well as career paths and options post 14.

Year 10

The focus is work experience including preparation, implementation, and evaluation; this can be used as part of the Duke of Edinburgh Award curriculum.

Not all students undertake work experience outside school due to their vulnerability and increased risk. Many will undertake work experience within the school, and this can be part of project work in vocational subjects. Some students will take on voluntary work which is supported by care homes. All work experience placements are assessed by Shropshire and Telford and Wrekin EBL with regards to suitability and health and safety.

Year 11+

The focus is on Post 16 options and the Application process. There will be visits to other educational/training providers, places of work, career fairs, apprenticeship shows and job centres and business enterprise specialists.

Our therapeutic offer

Trauma Informed Practice

Lamledge School is committed to fostering a trauma-informed environment, recognising the profound impact that trauma can have on a student's ability to learn and thrive. Our staff are trained to identify and support students who have experienced trauma, ensuring a safe and nurturing atmosphere where every child can feel secure and valued. This commitment to understanding and addressing the effects of trauma is integrated into all aspects of our educational approach, from classroom management to individualised support.

The language we use is key to being trauma informed. Language has the power to place blame on individuals and reinforce their negative self-concept (e.g. I'm bad and unlovable) as opposed to thinking about the wider context.

Our Facilities

Our clinical team can deliver lots of different interventions. We have art therapists, occupational health therapists, psychotherapists and speech & language therapists.

We have a therapy suite where we do 1:1 and group therapy.

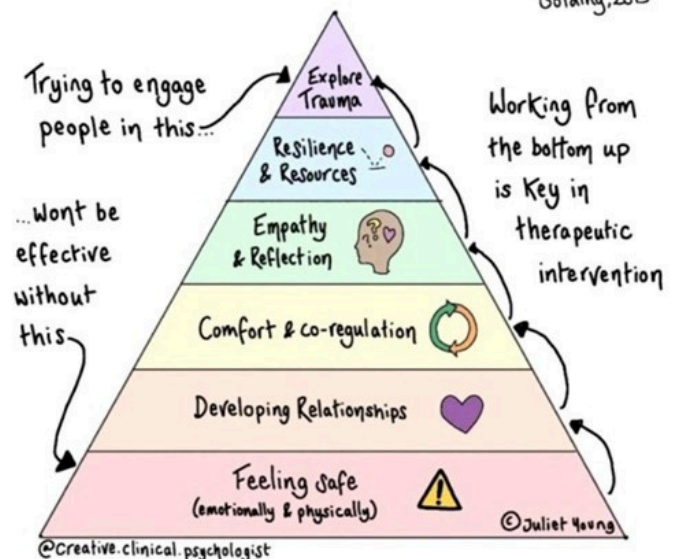
